

Highway 2

WIDENING PROJECT

Overview

The Highway 2 widening project is part of Commerce City's capital improvement program. The project includes expanding Highway 2 from two to four lanes between E. 72nd and I-76 to provide a higher level of service, improve safety, increase vehicle capacity, and accommodate pedestrians, bicyclists and vehicles. Funding is made available through a grant from the Colorado Department of Transportation and the City of Commerce City.

Schedule

Construction began in October 2016 and will be substantially complete this spring, with intermittent traffic impacts for construction activities necessary to open four lanes of travel. Typical project hours are 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. with night work to limit impacts when needed.

Traffic Impacts

Crews will shift the lanes of traffic in both directions along the project corridor to put down the final lane stripes. This work could involve periodic traffic stops and uniformed officers in the intersections to direct traffic, but it will not require any lane closures. Use caution and pay attention when driving through the work zone and expect periodic delays.

What's Ahead - April and May 2018

In addition to final lane striping, there will be miscellaneous construction activities along the length of the corridor to achieve substantial completion and open four lanes of travel this spring. Remaining construction activities include final grading and paving of the bike path, installation of the LED



pavement markers, continued work to install the guardrails, installing signs along the corridor, and landscaping. Construction of the drainage retention basins between 72nd Avenue and Rosemary Street/Quebec Parkway also continues. An event to celebrate substantial completion will take place in the next several weeks.
